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Summary of PPG spending 2016/17

Statement of intent;

To support all children who are disadvantaged, vulnerable, underachieving or in need of support.

Objectives;

- To remove barriers to learning
- To broaden experiences and widen opportunities for children

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Additional full-time class teacher in KS2 to reduce class sizes.

Provision of two full-time Learning Mentors who offer support to pupils and parents including individual support.

Ongoing 'Thrive' Training for Learning Mentor Team to enhance their provision.

Provide Teaching Assistant additional support to deliver Read Write Inc interventions.

Provide Teaching Assistant additional support to ensure all groups of pupils make at least expected progress.

Subsidised educational visits.

Teaching Intervention Resources.

Provide specialist visitors to deliver enrichment curriculum opportunities.

Fund counselling sessions for individual children in need of more specialist social and emotional support

Review of 2015-2016 expenditure

School Teacher Assessment data indicates that 50% of Pupil Premium pupils without SEND achieved the expected standard by the end of KS2 in reading, writing and maths.

The work of the Learning Mentor Team in 2015-2016 has had significant impact on removing barriers to learning. As a result, in 2016-17, the Learning Mentor Team will continue to consist of two full-time members of staff.

			<p>National: 75%</p> <p>Assessment data for Pupil Premium children indicates that 50% reached the expected standard in reading , 50% met the standard in writing and 66.7% met the standard in maths. These are much improved outcomes on 2015-16 which were R= 15%, W= 31%, M=23%)</p> <p>The work of the learning mentor team, along with the introduction of Thrive and individual counselling sessions, has continued to have a significant impact on removing barriers to learning.</p> <p>Providing additional TA support, focussed interventions and smaller class sizes has improved the quality of teaching. It has allowed teachers to better meet the needs of all children including those entitled to the Pupil Premium grant.</p>
